HISTORY MADE: A NEW EDIFICE AT OAU

The atmosphere in Ile-Ife was charged with glory as the GOFAMINT Students' Fellowship, Obafemi Awolowo University (GSFOAU) chapter, marked a historic milestone—the dedication of their new auditorium. It was a two-day convergence of gratitude, bringing together the GSF National body, guests from the Mission, sister fellowships, and alumni from across the nation.

DAY 1: The Altar of Mega Praise (Saturday, Nov 22nd) The weekend commenced with an explosion of sound and gratitude. We set aside the first day solely to raise an altar of thanksgiving to the God who builds cities and sanctuaries.

The Sound: The atmosphere was electrified by seasoned praise ministers including Min. Bukky Praise, Min. Fisayo Osho, Min. Toyosi Ojo, and Min. Ayodeji Balogun. They led the congregation in a session of intense, high-energy worship that set the tone for the dedication.

The Word: Pastor Dr. (Engr.) Tunde Ojo (Head of Youth and Campus Ministries) anchored the charge. He stirred the hearts of the students and alumni to recognize that the building is a tangible proof of God's faithfulness, urging everyone to remain rooted in the posture of worship.

DAY 2: The Grand Dedication (Sunday, Nov 23rd) Sunday was the crowning moment. Following a vibrant Sunday School and a praise session led by Min. Ademola Nath, the moment we had prayed for arrived.

The Commissioning: In a significant blending of the "Town and Gown," the ribbon-cutting ceremony was performed by the former Vice-Chancellor of Obafemi Awolowo University, Professor Eyitope Ogunbodede, marking the official opening of the doors.

The Rite: The General Secretary of the Mission conducted the solemn dedication rite, formally setting the building apart for the Lord's use.

The Journey: Emotions ran high as Pastor Dr. Oyebola (Chief Host and State Pastor) presented a special documentary. It chronicled the journey of the building project—the sacrifices, the waiting, and the ultimate triumph of faith.

The Charge: Following a powerful ministration by the Mass Choir, Pastor Tosin Oladapo (GOFAMINT, NA) delivered a piercing exhortation. He reminded the fellowship that while the building is magnificent, we must never forget the God of the house and the testimonies established within this community.

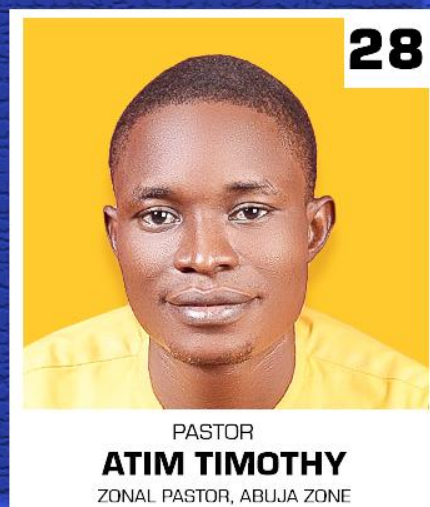
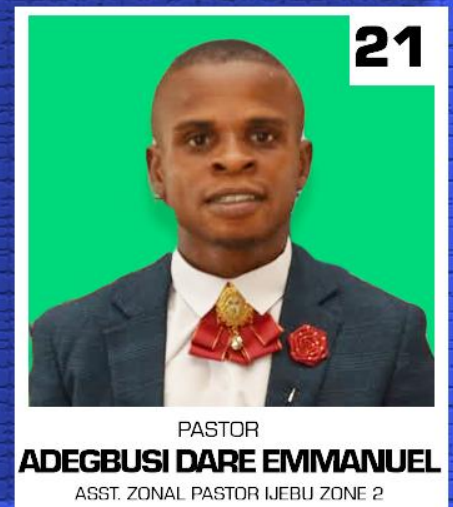
